

Introducing the Inaugural ACS Sustainable Chemistry & Engineering Lectureship Awards

We are pleased to announce the launch of the ACS Sustainable Chemistry & Engineering Lectureship Awards. The awards are a partnership between ACS Sustainable Chemistry & Engineering and the Industrial & Engineering Chemistry Division (I&EC) of the American Chemical Society. The awards will honor the contributions of early career investigators from around the world who are doing exceptional research that impacts sustainability, green chemistry, or green engineering.

The awards are intended to be global in scope, reflecting the global author and reader base of the journal. In the first year, in recognition of this global scope of the Lectureship Awards, one recipient will be chosen from each of the following three regions: The Americas, Europe/Middle East/Africa, and Asia/ Pacific. Nominees are affiliated with a geographical region based on the location of their current home scientific institution. Awardees should be 10 years or less from their initial academic appointment (for faculty members) or 10 years or less from their last professional training (for industrial and other nonacademic scientists). The selection committee will consist of ACS Sustainable Chemistry & Engineering editors as well as representatives from the I&EC Division of the American Chemical Society. In future years, other technical divisions of the ACS may join the journal in this partnership, assisting with the selection of the awardees and the sponsorship of the award. The first Lectureship Award winners will be honored at a symposium cosponsored by the I&EC Division at the 253rd ACS National Meeting in San Francisco, California, April 2-6, 2017. Each of the three inaugural Lectureship Award winners will receive \$1000 and assistance with travel and lodging costs.
